## Hello Oak Valley -

Happy Spring to everyone! As we start to put the freezing days behind us and look forward to warmth and sunshine, I encourage everyone to enjoy all the aspects our wonderful neighborhood has to give! Many of us miss visiting with neighbors during this past year and it is more important than ever to send a friendly wave or hello across the yards. A lot of us have struggled with this past year being cooped up without much interaction and small gestures would go a long way. Maybe consider raking an elderly neighbor's yard, dropping off a container of cookies, or simply a phone call to ask how someone is doing. These things may seem small, but it's often just the sentiment of knowing someone is paying attention and cares is enough to help our neighbors through the week.



## Spring Planting -

Mike has planted colorful Pansies at our entrance monument. At the beginning of April, Mike will be laying down the Crabgrass preventer and fertilizer application. In late May he will have the irrigation turned on to keep things vibrant and healthy.

Mike lays down mulch on alternating years so he will not be working with mulch this year. He will be spraying for weeds in all the cul-de-sacs. He welcomes any proposals to add flowers, rose bushes, or any other type of plants to your cul-de-sacs. Oak Valley will reimburse anyone whose idea is approved. In late June, Mike will be spraying for weeds around the mailboxes, sewer drains, and curbs and will repeat this if necessary. These additions and details that are maintained for Oak Valley's landscape make such a huge difference in setting us apart from many other subdivisions. All landscaping needs are provided by Mike Rzeszut. He's been volunteering to take care of Oak Valley's landscaping single-handedly since 2012. Whenever you see him out working, please give him a friendly wave or stop and visit. We all highly appreciate everything he does for our neighborhood!

## Ash Trees -

As most of you already know, most Ash trees in Lenexa have been infested with the Emerald Ash Borer Beetle and are needing to be removed. Mike did an assessment of Oak Valley's Ash trees last summer and found approximately 70 trees needing to be removed. In that time we have had several families make the difficult and expensive decision to remove their Ash trees. Some families have had 4-7 trees that they've had to remove from their properties including have their stumps ground out. This is a reminder that if your Ash tree does not produce leaves, it needs to be removed. If your Ash tree is only producing leaves around the trunk, this also indicates that it is dead or dying. The city will not remove your Ash tree even if it is a street tree. Dead trees create a hazard to pedestrians and property. As most Kansans know, we experience a myriad of weather including, high winds, thunderstorms, tornadoes and freezing rain. All of which can bring down a dead Ash tree. If your Ash tree limbs, branches, or entire tree comes down, it is your responsibility to pay for any and all damages while additionally having the debris removed promptly.

For those of you that are still producing leaves, the best way to keep your trees from dying are to have them treated. This treatment needs to be done in May, June, or July every year.



### **Annual Meeting/Annual Dues (January 2021) -**

We had our Annual Meeting January 31st, 2021. This meeting was conducted through video conference using Zoom. During this meeting, there was a vote about the yearly dues and it was voted in the majority to keep the Annual Dues at \$225 per year. All due notices were sent out in the third and fourth weeks of February. Please remit your payment to: Oak Valley Home Association; P O Box 14081; Lenexa; Kansas; 66285.

The bulk of annual dues goes towards paying trash collection fees. If dues are not collected by June 1st, the Oak Valley HOA can choose to pause your trash collection services until your dues are paid in full. 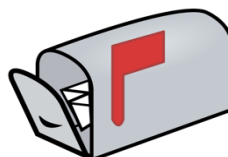

### **Treasurer's Update -**

At our Annual Meeting in January a question was posed to our Treasurer, Bob, if he currently had any backup for his position, which includes mailing out bills, receiving and posting dues and dealing with banking needs and balancing our budget. At that time, the answer was no, which caused concern for a few of our homeowners.

As of March 1st, both our president, Rick, and our Vice President, Manoj, are signers on the Oak Valley bank account to serve as back ups for part of Bob's duties. This step was necessary to ease up any burdens Bob may have and also ensure that if he were to decide to take a much needed vacation or days off from his duties, someone on the board has got his back.



### **Mail Box Clusters -**

We have had a few complaints concerning our mail box clusters. Some of these complaints are concerning rusting, leaking, and wobbly post issues having to do with our parcel and mail clusters. A work order for 10 of the 13 clusters was submitted the middle of January 2021. I recently spoke to the Post Office representative who took the order and was told that one of the mail box clusters was

replaced entirely on Candlelight Lane. This required all homeowners who use that cluster to go to the post office to receive their mail and new keys to their units.

The representative then stated that our mail carrier had inspected the remaining boxes and deemed no other clusters needed to be replaced but that the majority of them needed to be sealed and repainted. He was unable to give me the addresses of the clusters that are deemed to receive this service.

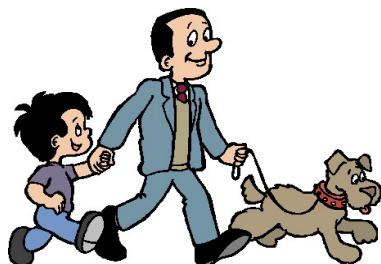
### **Annual Garage Sale -**
