Gotta LOVE Nature!

Josh, the Vice President on our board, has found some interesting information about a new resident in Oak Valley. According to a few reports, we may actually have a beaver in our creek! So the next time you're walking the trails, look out for the signs: peeled branches, slides, and freshly cut trees. Josh sent over a few pictures of these signs and said he found them along the creek around the area where we have our Block parties.

Once Spring is here, our wildlife activity will increase. Please remember that the creek is an extremely important eco-system for our furry, feathered, reptilian, and amphibian friends. Please do not discard your trash or yard waste in or near the creek.

Another incredible sight to see along our walking trail this Spring are the daffodils! A Lenexa resident donated 12,000 daffodil bulbs to the City of Lenexa who planted them along the trail from 87th Street to 79th Street. They first bloomed last Spring and they were beautiful.

Ash Tree Removal -

We've seen several neighbors removing their Ash trees and we can't thank you enough! Right now is the best time of the year to have your trees removed. We have many Ash trees that have been destroyed due to the invasive Emerald Ash Borer. The signs of your tree having succumbed to this insect are; branches that do not bloom or leaves only coming in on the lower part of the trunk. You may also find "D" shaped holes in your bark. These trees can be treated but you must start treatments before signs of infestation begin and they are needed once a year to ensure the health of your Ash tree.



Give a Wave to Mike!

For those of you who don't know, our Landscaping board member is Mike Rzeszut. You will see him around our mailboxes, driveways, monument, cul-de-sacs, well... just about EVERYWHERE! Mike sprays our general areas for weeds and maintains both of our monuments in our neighborhood. He plants, trims, mulches, and maintains our sprinkler system at the main entrance monument. If you see him out beautifying Oak Valley, make sure to give him a wave or honk to thank him. If you have any questions about your Ash tree or lawn, feel free to stop and talk to him while he's working. Mike is always available with advice and a great smile.

Discuss Before You Construct -

Warmer weather means construction and updates. Please make sure you check out the Building Restrictions before you update anything to your fence, deck, painting, porch, or major yard changes. You can find these restrictions on our Website. You must also gain approval with our Architectural Board Member, Larry Rector. This includes everything listed above. We're a very easy going board, but we do want to maintain a beautiful neighborhood so ask that everyone comply with the very few rules that have been put in place. Two of our more stringent rules are that we do not allow any free-standing sheds or above ground pools in Oak Valley. Oak Valley's Neighborhood Garage Sale -
